This Month In Republic of Texas History

August 24, 1838 Nacogdoches, Texas

Vincente Cordova, a Mexican alcalde in Nacogdoches and one of the area's largest landholders, attempted to incite rebellion amongst the citizens of Nacogdoches against the Republic of Texas earlier in the month.

Today, Cordova escaped from justice. Major H. W. Augustine, who has been following his trail with 150 men, has failed to make contact and has given up the search. General T. J. Rusk, also searching for Cordova, learned that he had dispersed most of his men and headed to the upper Trinity River area.

MIni Mac & Cheese Bites



- 2 C Uncooked elbow macaroni
- 1 C Seasoned bread crumbs, divided
- 2 Tbs. Butter
- 2 Tbs. All-purpose flour
- ½ tsp. Onion powder
- ½ tsp. Garlic powder
- ½ tsp. Seasoned salt
- 1³/₄ C 2% milk
- 2 C Shredded sharp cheddar cheese, divided
- 1 C Shredded Swiss cheese
- 3/4 C Biscuit/baking mix
- 2 Large eggs, lightly beaten

Preheat oven to 425°. Cook macaroni as package directs and drain.

Meanwhile, sprinkle ¼ C bread crumbs into 36 greased mini-muffin cups. In a large saucepan, melt butter over medium heat. Stir in flour and seasonings until smooth; gradually whisk in milk. Bring to a boil, stirring constantly, cook and stir 1-2 minutes or until thickened. Stir in 1 C cheddar cheese and Swiss cheese until melted.

Remove from heat; stir in biscuit mix, eggs and ½ C breadcrumbs. Add macaroni; toss to coat. Spoon about 2 Tbs. macaroni mixture into mini-muffin cups; sprinkle with remaining cheddar cheese and bread crumbs.

Bake 8-10 minutes or until golden brown. Cool in pans 5 minutes before serving.
