This Month In Republic of Texas History

June 3, 1836 Goliad, TX


Today General Thomas J. Rusk, commander-in-chief of the Texas Army, officiated a military funeral for the 330 Texians killed at the Goliad Massacre. Skeletons and partially burned bones that had been strewn about the site where they were killed were placed in a common grave. General Rusk was so overcome with emotion that someone else had to read his funeral oration, which began:

"Fellow soldiers! In the order of Providence we are this day called upon to pay the last sad offices of respect to the remains of the noble and heroic band who, battling for our sacred rights, have fallen beneath the ruthless hand of a tyrant." The speech later said of Santa Anna, "While the names of those whom he murdered shall soar to the highest pinnacle of fame, his shall sink down to the deepest depths of infamy and disgrace."


