### Texas History

#### Saturday, March 1, 1845:

Today, John Tyler, President of the United States, signed a joint resolution of the U.S. Congress authorizing the President to enter into negotiations with the Republic of Texas regarding terms of annexation to the Union. The bill provides that Texas be admitted with a republican form of government to be adopted by Texas before July 1, 1846, upon the following conditions: All boundary adjustments will be made by the United States; the State of Texas shall retain its own public lands and apply the income from these to the debts of the Republic; and if Texas approves, the state may be divided into four. The President of the U.S. was authorized to negotiate new terms with Texas if needed.
